DID YOU KNOW THAT?

If you have a Lifesling along with the block and tackle and have never practiced hooking it up, you will be fumbling around figuring it while trying to rescue someone overboard. To say the person in the water loses confidence in your ability is an understatement. Just reading the instructions on the side of the bag is not enough. You have to take the contents out of the bag and practice hooking things up. A good place to do this is at dockside. Practice hauling a crew member from the dock onto the boat. Sounds easy? Not really. Last spring Alan Johnson demonstrated the procedure to a group at dockside, then asked one of them to do it. It was morbidly humorous. Nothing went right. The moral that everyone learned was, to get it right, practice, practice, practice,

While we are thinking safety, how many of you file a float plan when you go out for a cruise? Just as I thought. NO ONE. The Coast Guard recommends that a float plan be filed listing the names of all the people on board. It helps them during any rescue operation to have that information.

It is prudent to follow the advice of the professionals.
